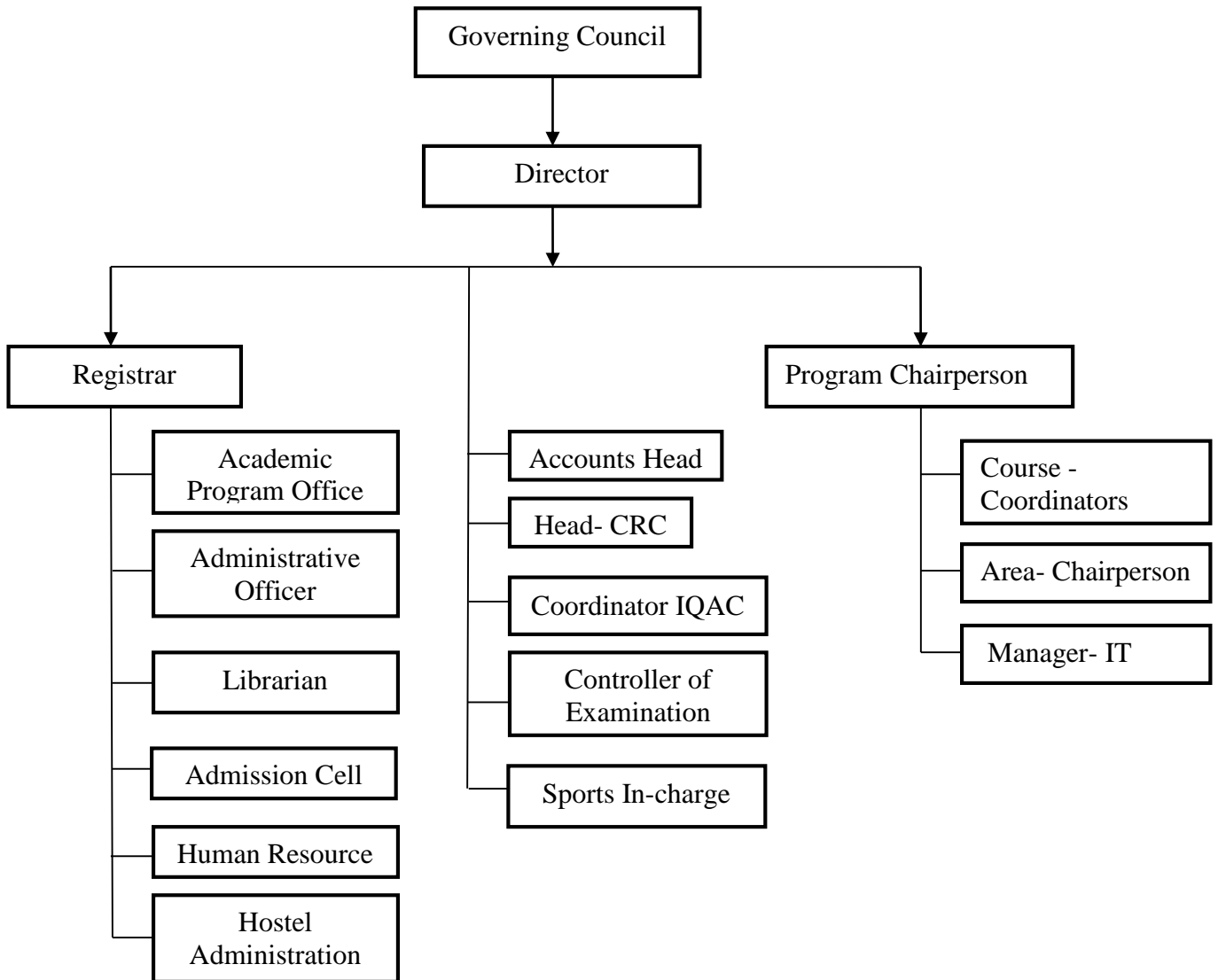

1. Reformed Teaching Learning Process

It is a combined process where a teacher assesses understanding needs, establishes particular learning objectives, formulates teaching strategies, enforces a plan of work, and assesses the outcomes of the instruction. Teaching-learning process consists of various variables

- a) Student centric learning
- b) Activity based learning
- c) Project based learning
- d) Technical Quiz
- e) Student Mentoring

2. Campus to Corporate:

Special sessions are being organized under “Campus to Corporate” theme to make students aware of corporate culture and prepare them with the necessary skills required such as time management, planning and prioritization, team building skills, goal setting etc. Campus to corporate training is a soft skills program that helps students transition smoothly into corporate life

3. Centre of Excellence:

A) Innovation and Entrepreneurship:

Brief Description:

Institute of Technology and Science, continuously endeavors to create an ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship by encouraging ideas for startups and sowing seeds for cultivating and honing entrepreneurial abilities among students. Towards this it also works in tandem with the goals of Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Govt. of India that has established ‘MHRD’s Innovation Cell (MIC)’ to systematically foster the culture of innovation.

a) Institution Innovation Council (IIC):

A fully fledged and active IIC cell functions in the institute for knowledge sharing towards promoting the culture of entrepreneurship, innovation and incubation. It aims to establish a dynamic Ecosystem for Scouting Ideas and Pre-incubation of Ideas by way of orientation of students and faculty on IPR, design thinking, prototyping, building business models and

canvas. The institute focuses on identifying budding entrepreneurs and offering them the required support in terms of logistics, technical support, location of potential investors, collaborating with incubators etc.

b) National Innovation and Startup Policy (NISP):

As per the directions of Ministry of Education's Innovation cell, the NISP was formulated in the institute and its implementation ensured with guidance of external experts active in the fields of incubators, startups, industry and academia. With the implementation of its own NISP document, the institute seeks to create a healthy, promising and facilitating culture for young innovators, entrepreneurs and startups in overcoming barriers while trying to market their innovation and growth from scratch to scale.

c) Business incubation centre of MSME:

The Ministry of MSME has approved the establishment of business incubation centre in 2020 and 2021 at the campus highlighting the credibility of its efforts in developing and shaping an environment of innovation in the minds of its student innovators.

Activities satisfying the framework of innovation carried out by the institute include exposure of students to concepts of product identification, product and market fit, market analysis, cost model, revenue model and breakeven analysis through its ongoing orientation sessions including workshops, guest lectures, business plan competitions, inter college events like business, startup, innovation, entrepreneurship summits and conventions.

B) Centre for Executive Education (Management Development Program - MDP)

I.T.S Ghaziabad has highly acclaimed MDPs centre around key business fundamentals like Managerial Effectiveness, Team Building, Effective Communication, Cost Management, Sales & Marketing skills, Rural Marketing etc These programmes are in the nature of 'open-enrolment' courses with participation open to all practicing/experienced managers and/or executives.

The pedagogy employed involves a variety of teaching methods: case studies, simulations, role plays, closed group analyses, and applied learning projects, interspersed with lecture sessions on theory and practice. The sessions are essentially interactive, and participants are encouraged to question assumptions, identify opportunities, solve complex problems, develop operational performance, boost productivity, and in the process, build sustainable competitive advantage. The knowledge and insights gained as a result of such sessions have immediate applications for management challenges.

Institute also offers exclusive customized programs, to address specific Executive Learning and/or Corporate Training mandates from individual organizations. In this format, training contents are designed in collaboration with the client organization, and scheduled at a mutually convenient date and venue.

4. Green Initiative:

- A third party audit of the Institute in respect of Green Audit, Energy Audit and Environmental Audit.
- The Institute advocates the benefits of renewable energy and therefore installed a 250 KWp solar power generating system on roof tops of all academic blocks of the Campus to meet the energy needs of the Institute. Apart from this solar water heating system is also provided in both the hostels.
- Rain Water Harvesting is done in the Campus at different places.

5. Other Activities:

- **Student Outreach Program:** The Institute organizes an annual quiz series for outside colleges at nearby areas. This Activity requires support from students as coordinators. The purpose of the program is to provide school students valuable exposure of higher education and motivate them for Management/ Technical education.
- **International Exposure:** The Institute has signed MOUs with many foreign Universities and Institutions in order to provide cross cultural exposure and global perspective to the students.
- **Value added courses:** Value added courses have been made a part of the curricula in order to increase the employability of the students by equipping them with essential skills as per the expectations of the Industry. The purpose is to bridge the skill gap and make students industry ready.
- **Placement training program:** To make the students job ready, students are provided with aptitude training, Resume writing practice, mock test, mock interviews etc.
- **Club Activities:** To develop leadership and social skills among students, the Institute creates various interest / hobby clubs of students. The Institute firmly believes in holistic approach of learning by balancing academics and extra-curricular activities of students. Digitalytics Club, Cultural Club, Marketing Club- Marrecus, HR Club- OPPO Makers, Sankriya Club, Finance Club- Finvest, Statesman Club, Utthan Lab, Parivartan.
- **Organizing unique events:** In order to provide exposure to its students the Institute organizes events like Business Summit, Utkrisht Marketing Awards, CXO Meet, Media Meet and International Conference etc round the year. Annexure-4 (Curricula and Syllabi)

The PGDM course aims at providing inputs to the students relevant to the business, industry and trade, so that they can be placed in these sectors and functions, in different organizations. The course not only aims at providing knowledge and skills in different areas of management, but also provides value based inputs necessary for the overall development of the personality of the students

The course curriculum is spread over six Trimesters in a period of 2 years, during which the core and elective courses are offered by the Institute.

The course offered to the student may be a 3 credit, 1.5 credit, 1 credit or non-credit course. The Institute uses the concept of credit to define the weightage of a course in the curriculum. Courses are listed as 3, or 1.5 credits course depending on the enlisted workload for each course. The generally accepted norm is that, a three (3) credit involves about 30 hours of class work, 1.5 credit course involves about 15 hours and one (1) credit course involves about 10 hours of class work.

Trimester-wise Credit Breakup: PGDM Programme consists of total one hundred Sixteen (116) credits. Out of this, one hundred seven (107) credits are devoted to courses, Six (6) credits to summer training project. Two (2) credit to Minor Project, One (1) credit to Social Immersion Programme, Business Intelligence Lab is a non-credit, course. Business Intelligence Lab is a non-credit, course.
